




## RIPE Policy Development Update

- The RIPE community develops and sets policies for the technical coordination of the Internet and the distribution of Internet number resources in the RIPE NCC's service region.
- "RIPE community" is the collective term for individuals and organisations, members or not, that have an interest in the way the Internet is managed, structured or governed.

## **Current Policy Discussions**

## 2015-03: "Assessment Criteria for IPv6 Initial Allocation Size"

- Aims to remove the requirement that allocation size will be based only on existing users
- Allows consideration of additional criteria for non-ISP organisation with IPv6 plans
- Status: initial discussion phase

# 2015-02: "Keep IPv6 PI When Requesting IPv6 Allocation"

- Removes the requirement that LIRs have to return their IPv6 PI assignment when requesting and IPv6 allocation
- Status: impact analysis gets created, then Review Phase



# 2014-03: "Remove Multihoming Requirement for AS Number Assignments"

- Aims to allow ASN assignments for any need
- Status: authors will revise the proposal and then a new Review Phase
- 2015-01: "Alignment of Transfer Requirements for IPv4 Allocations"
  - Aims to align the transfer requirements with a 24-month holding period for all IPv4 allocations
  - Status: Review Phase




#### **Recently Accepted Policy Proposals**

- 2014-12: "Allow IPv6 Transfers"
- 2014-13: "Allow AS Number Transfers"
  - Now all Internet resources can be transferred within RIPE
     NCC service region
    - Includes IPv4 PA, IPv4 PI, IPv6 PA, IPv6 PI and ASN
  - Implementation expected about July 2015
- 2014-05: "Policy for Inter-RIR Transfers of Internet Resources"
  - Allows transfers of resources with other regions with compatible transfer policies (currently ARIN and APNIC)
  - Implementation expected about August 2015
